



Davey The Daisy's Flower Shop Class




Welcome!




STEP ONE:

Gather Supplies

First off, find a temporary space in your home to set up your new flower shop. Set up a small table or stand as your main workstation and gather the supplies below:

- A pair of scissors or clippers for trimming your stems
- 1-4 Vases or jars for holding your bouquets
- A chair for yourself and one or two for your customers
- Paper & drawing supplies for creating your shop sign and business cards
- Some tape for your signage & decorating and sticking the price tags to your vases
- Large brown or white sheets of paper for wrapping your bouquets (optional)
- Print out the Davey Daisy money from the last page and small box for your till



STEP TWO:

Create A Flower Shop Name & Logo

You will want to come up with a unique name and a logo for your flower shop. A logo is the artistic symbol you draw that includes your business name, colours, and anything else you want to draw so your customers recognize and remember your Flower Shop.


- A. Start by writing down ideas for the name and then start sketching out fun and unique ways to spell it and other fun cartoons or symbols for your logo.
- B. Once you find something you like, cut out your business card from the cut out section on page 6 and draw a clean copy of your new logo on the card on one side. Flip the card and write out your name, job title (Florist) and pretend website and phone number and you got a fancy dancy business card!
- C. Make your bouquets and pick prices for them. Put them in vases so they stay fresh for customers.

STEP THREE:


Shop ready to open

- A. Tell your family or friends around you that your flower shop is now open and why they should come check it out. (don't forget to give your customers half of your special florist money from the cut-outs to spend on your shop! Keep the other half for your till in case you need to give them change.
- B. Welcome your customers, maybe offer them a seat if they need to wait in line, and tell about your different creations and options they can choose to buy.
- C. Most importantly have fun running your shop and creating your own flower creations!
